Last Friday was a great night of basketball at FC. We had a tremendous crowd and had to fight back to tie the game against a Rox team riding a 5-game win streak. We forced overtime despite a near-disaster at the end of regulation in which we were trying to get the last shot, but turned the ball over instead. In overtime, our three captains (Pierce, Woodrow, Corey) scored all 6 of our points including two free throws by Clayton Corey that gave us the final winning margin. Andrew Golia came up big for us off the bench with 4 rebounds including a great put-back that we desperately needed in the 3rd quarter. This final was a 65-62 overtime victory. Ethan Woodrow led the Mustangs in scoring with 28 points (along with 12 rebounds) while Koby Pierce had one of his best games of the year with 21 points and 2 steals. I am relieved that I will not have to coach against Keiontre Wilkey again, as he had 34 points against us last year, and 30 Friday night!

The Lady Mustangs used a 26-6 run in the second half before cruising to a 39-23 victory, avenging a late-season loss to the Patriots. Macee Williams totaled 21 points and 7 rebounds and made a great play to outrun Seeger players for a loose ball before taking it the length of the floor to score. Olivia Woodrow provided some big minutes off the bench, and Mustang guards Morgan Grubb, Samantha Pigg, Kyla Keeling, and Chynna Yager negated the quickness of the Seeger guards throughout the game.
