## HIGHS AND LOWS OF LAST WEEK:

The Mustangs traveled to Crawfordsville last weekend and were able to come out with a hard-fought 60-48 victory. Koby Pierce came out of his recent free throw struggles with a 6/6 performance on his way to 19 points. Ethan Woodrow had 21 points, and Clayton Corey added 10 pts. Ladd Warner grabbed 10 rebounds to go with his 8 points. The Mustangs were 17/20 from the free throw line on the night, enabling them to turn a 3-point game with 4:00 to play into a 12-point win.



While we were able to finish strong on Friday night, Saturday night did not work out the same way. South Newton (9-2) was able to get several easy shots in the last 4 minutes of the contest, and though the Mustangs made several big shots down the stretch as well, we just couldn't get the defensive stops we needed. After Koby Pierce hit a short jumper to tie the game at 54 with 11 seconds to play, the Rebels were able to penetrate the Mustang defense and kick to an open Jarrett Hammel for the winning basket at the buzzer. It was a disappointing ending to a very competitive game, and not the way I was hoping to celebrate my birthday.



Mustang point guard Clayton Corey hit the floor hard on a shot block attempt late in the game and was not able to return. We are hoping for the best with Clayton as he recovers. While no time table has been set yet, we are hopeful that Clayton will be able to return in a couple weeks. We will know more later.

### BENTON CENTRAL BISON

Saturday night, the Mustangs host the Benton Central Bison (4-9). The Bison have been very competitive against some really good teams this season. Though they are coming off two losses, those losses were to very, very good teams (Tipton & LCC). Jack Marquie leads the Bison at 13.1ppg and 5.3 rebounds per game. He has scored in double figures in each of the last 6 games while shooting well over 60% from the field. Henry Fisher also averages 11.2 points and 7.3 rebounds for the Bison. He is one of the best offensive rebounders we will see this season. As a team, the Bison are very athletic – they get to the paint very well, and they crash the offensive boards very hard. Rebounding will be an important factor in the outcome of the game.



## WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEKEND:

The Mustangs need to bounce back from a disappointing loss on Saturday night. Effort in practice so far this week has been better and we need to make some late-season improvements at the defensive end. Our players are working hard to improve our defense and ball movement as the post-season approaches. This weekend poses some different challenges for the Mustangs defensively, as the Eagles are an excellent 3-point shooting team, while the Bison are better at driving and rebounding. It will be interesting to see how we respond.
