The Mustangs are coming off their best season in quite some time. We won 18 games last season before falling to a very good Delphi team in the sectional championship. We return two starters from that team and feel very good about this year's team.

They have won over 72% of their games under Coach Barrett and the Knights have won a whopping 12 consecutive sectional championships. A key for us today will be taking care of the basketball. The Knights are usually one of the most difficult teams to pass against, and with the graduation of many of our guards, this is something we want to see right away. One of our strengths last season was keeping our turnovers very low, and we graduated a lot of guards, so seeing how some new players will step up into new roles early will be interesting.
