After winning their opener against South Newton, the Lady Mustangs traveled to Coach Amie Anthrop's alma mater, Clinton Prairie. Last year, the Mustangs lost a close game against the Gophers and this year, the Gophers came out red hot from 3-point range to start the game. We are shooting the ball better every day in practice and need to take advantage of that while also getting as many lay-ups as possible. To be successful this early in the season, it is important for us to apply a great deal of pressure defensively and force the Panthers into some turnovers early in the game. Next week, we host Covington and travel to North Montgomery. Mustang fans will get a chance to see some of the best talent on our schedule next weekend in Chandler Spring and Jordan Ahrens (Covington) and Grant Gaylor (North Montgomery). The Trojans of Covington are the pre-season to win the WRC as well as their first sectional in several years. North Montgomery will be improved from last season and Gaylor is arguably the best player we will see this season. Slowing these players down is crucial to avoiding a disappointing weekend.
